The **Frederick Douglass Foundation** values the trust and generosity of its supporters. Donors play an essential role in advancing the organization's mission to promote faith, freedom, personal responsibility, and opportunity.

In recognition of this partnership, the Frederick Douglass Foundation affirms that donors have the right to:

Transparency and Accountability

- Be informed of the organization's mission and how donated funds are used
- Know that contributions will be used for the purposes for which they were given
- Receive accurate and timely acknowledgment of contributions

Respect and Confidentiality

- Expect that personal information provided to the organization will be handled with respect and confidentiality
- Know that donor information will not be sold, rented, or traded to outside organizations

Communication Preferences

- Request removal from mailing lists or communications
- Choose whether their contribution will be publicly recognized or remain anonymous

Responsible Stewardship

- Receive responses to reasonable questions regarding the organization's programs, finances, and activities
- Know that the organization exercises appropriate financial oversight and stewardship of contributions
